# Q&A with Haunted Trail Director,

#### What is your first memory or encounter of Haunted Trail?

We've pulled out all the stops for this years theme 'The Dead Man's Curse'. We've taken months of planning and care and created the best trail we can with our talented designers. From set design, to costuming, to the performances, everything is crafted to scare. We have an incredible team of actors and builds for this year that will be sure to give everyone thrills! And, with such an iconic theme, people are sure to love the horror and gore.

#### Can you describe this year's Haunted Trail in three words?
