

One-Minute Chocolate Chip Cookie

Who doesn't love a homemade chocolate chip cookie? Well, all you need is 60 seconds and you can enjoy warm, gooey bliss. Check out this recipe for a one-minute chocolate chip cookie in a mug.

Ingredients:

- 1 Tablespoon unsalted butter
- 1 Tablespoon granulated sugar
- 1 Tablespoon brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1 egg yolk
- 3 Tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1-2 Tablespoons chocolate chips

Directions:

1. Add butter to a mug and microwave until melted
2. Mix in both sugars, vanilla extract and salt until well-combined
3. Mix in egg yolk then flour
4. Fold in chocolate chips
5. Microwave on high for about 40 seconds (50 at most).
6. Grab a spoon and enjoy!

If you are replacing your roof with the same color and style shingle, and it meets the current roofing guidelines, you do NOT need to submit for approval. We do ask that you contact Sally D'Amour at 972-317-5139 or sdamour@ccmnet.com to let her know you are replacing the roof with no changes in color or style (please include your address). If making a change to the color, style, material, etc., please submit an application along with the roof material, specifications and color (sample needed if not using Weathered Wood color) for approval. Submittal form & guidelines are available at www.highlandshores.net.

We are making an exception on signage due to the number of homes that sustained damage. The Association will allow the roofing company's sign (one sign only) to be in your yard, upon contract, during the construction process. Once the project is complete, the sign needs to be removed.

- 4. Do regular tick checks.**
Be sure to check your pet's skin, ears and armpits for ticks. The best way to prevent disease is to find and get rid of any ticks as soon as possible.
- 5. Vacuum frequently.**
Fleas can live and breed in your carpet so be sure to vacuum often and dispose of the bags immediately after use. It's also important to wash your pet's bedding weekly.
- 6. Keep your yard clean.**
Ticks tend to hide in high grasses so be sure to mow regularly. Always rake leaves and remove clippings from your yard because fleas love warm, shady areas.




The Power Breakfast Quinoa Bowl features loads of vegetables and eggs on top of protein-packed quinoa. The fresh juice bar will satisfy your taste buds and keep you feeling great. The Kale Tonic combines kale, Fuji apples, cucumber and lemon to make a tasty drink. Or try the Morning Meditation, a delicious blend of oranges, lemon, turmeric, organic ginger, agave nectar and beets.

"First Watch is all about farm-fresh healthy food that looks great and tastes better," says Moline.




