

Easter Tradition's Around the World


Bermudians fly handmade kites made of flat sticks, glue, string, and colorful tissue paper.

Rara is celebrated in Haiti every year at Easter. This celebration revolves around festival music played during street processions.




Some Filipino children dress up as angels and take part in a religious procession, while singing and scattering flowers.










Book Readers Supper Club

Now a major motion picture from Netflix, directed by Dee Rees, nominated in four categories for the Academy Awards



As Kingsolver says of Hillary Jordan, "Her characters walked straight out of 1940s Mississippi and into the part of my brain where sympathy and anger and love reside, leaving my heart racing. They are with me still."
